


The World Happiness Report is based on in-country surveys of the citizens of 155 countries, conducted by the Gallup Poll organization. Respondents are asked to imagine the best possible life and then rate their happiness on a scale from 1-10. The weighted surveys determine a country's overall happiness score.



Respondents were asked to rank their nation in terms of Family support, Freedom, Trust in Government, and Generosity on a 1-10 scale. The report also identified GDP data and Healthy Life Expectancy, using OECD and WHO data.




These six categories are used to explain the overall happiness per country. A seventh category, Dystopia Residual, accounts for happiness not explained by the other six variables. The summation of all the seven variables constitute Happiness Score.

## What happened between 2015 and 2017?




Changes between Scores and ranks of the five happiest countries of 2017 have been small. These changes may represent shifts in economic health as well as perception of people selected for the survey. In general, changes in the happiest countries have been incremental.
